COURSE GUIDE LEGEND

Distances in **BLACK** are from 2m from the back of the White tee

Distances in **RED** are to the front point of the green

RED circles (●) represent drainage covers

All distances marked on drainage covers and sprinkler heads are to the **FRONT** of the green

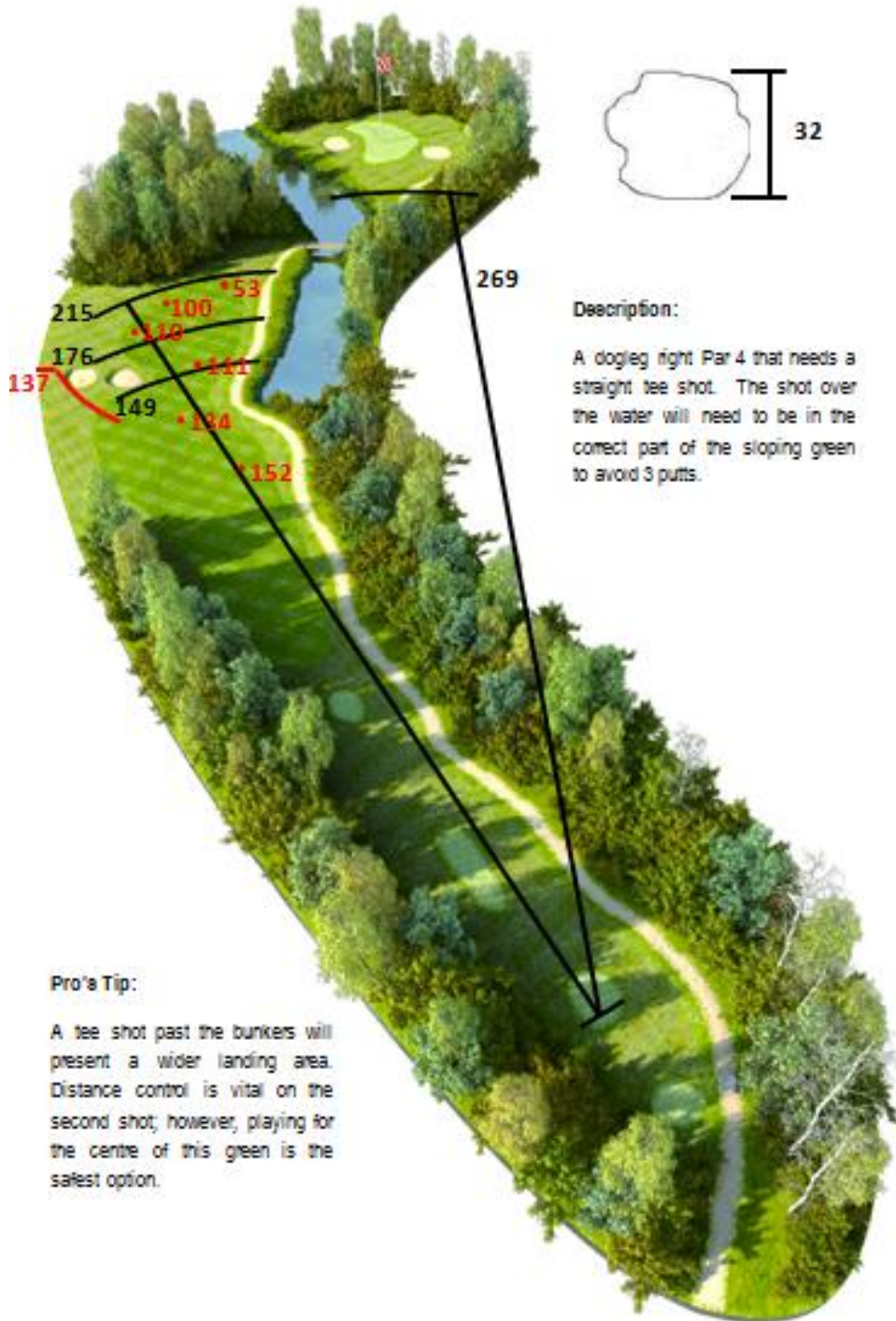
Wooden markers are to the centre of the green

In the event of thunder and lightning a horn will be sounded and play immediately suspended.

HOLE 1 – 310m

HOLE 2 – 155m



Description:

A dogleg right Par 4 that needs a straight tee shot. The shot over the water will need to be in the correct part of the sloping green to avoid 3 putts.

Pro's Tip:

A tee shot past the bunkers will present a wider landing area. Distance control is vital on the second shot; however, playing for the centre of this green is the safest option.



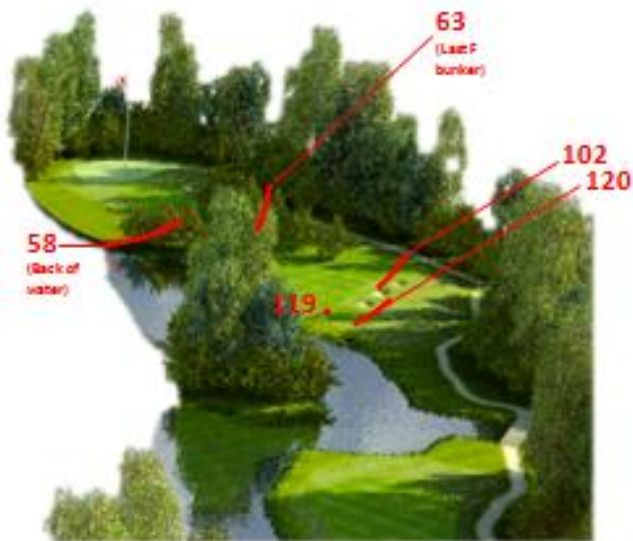
Description:

This Par-3 is surrounded by water. However, the large green gives lots of room to land a high shot. A bunker protects the front of the green next to a fairway, on which to land shorter shots.

Pro's Tip:

A much larger green than perceived from the tee means that choosing the right club for the distance is important to this shot. A high shot will give a better chance of keeping the ball on the green. The safe is to land the ball on the left half of the green.

HOLE 3 – 489m



Pro's Tip:

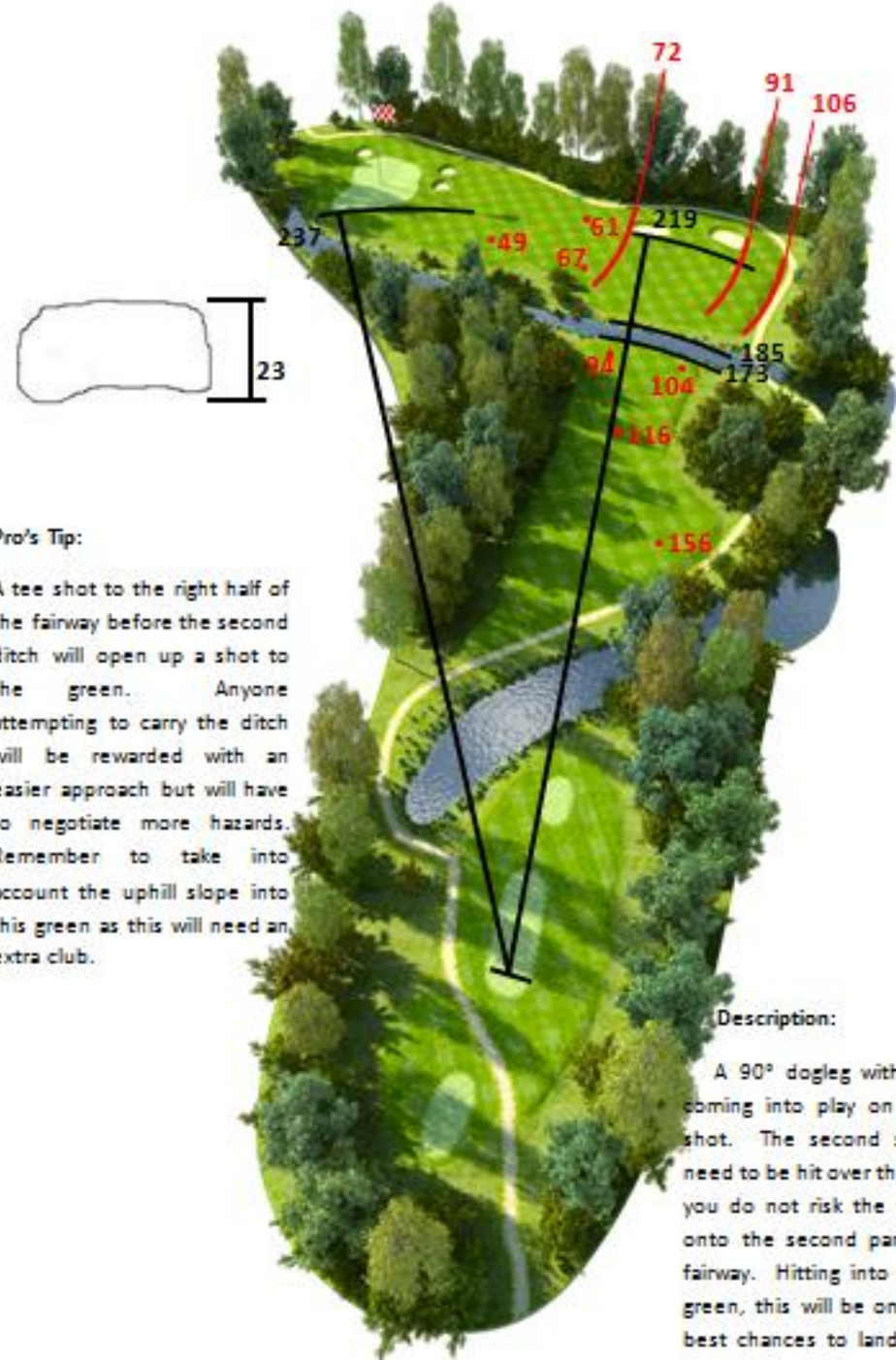
A conservative strategy will ensure that the dangers on this hole are avoided. Risk could result in a birdie, but most likely a big number. A lay-up to 80m will provide the best chance of getting close to the pin. But try to stay clear of any of the deep bunkers on the way.

Description:

The first of four Par-5s, and the hardest hole on the course. This hole requires a well-placed tee shot either before or over the bunkers depending on strategy. A second shot over the water demands a longer carry with added risk by hitting towards the green. A good lay-up provides a simple approach shot to a well-guarded green.



HOLE 4 – 308m



Pro's Tip:

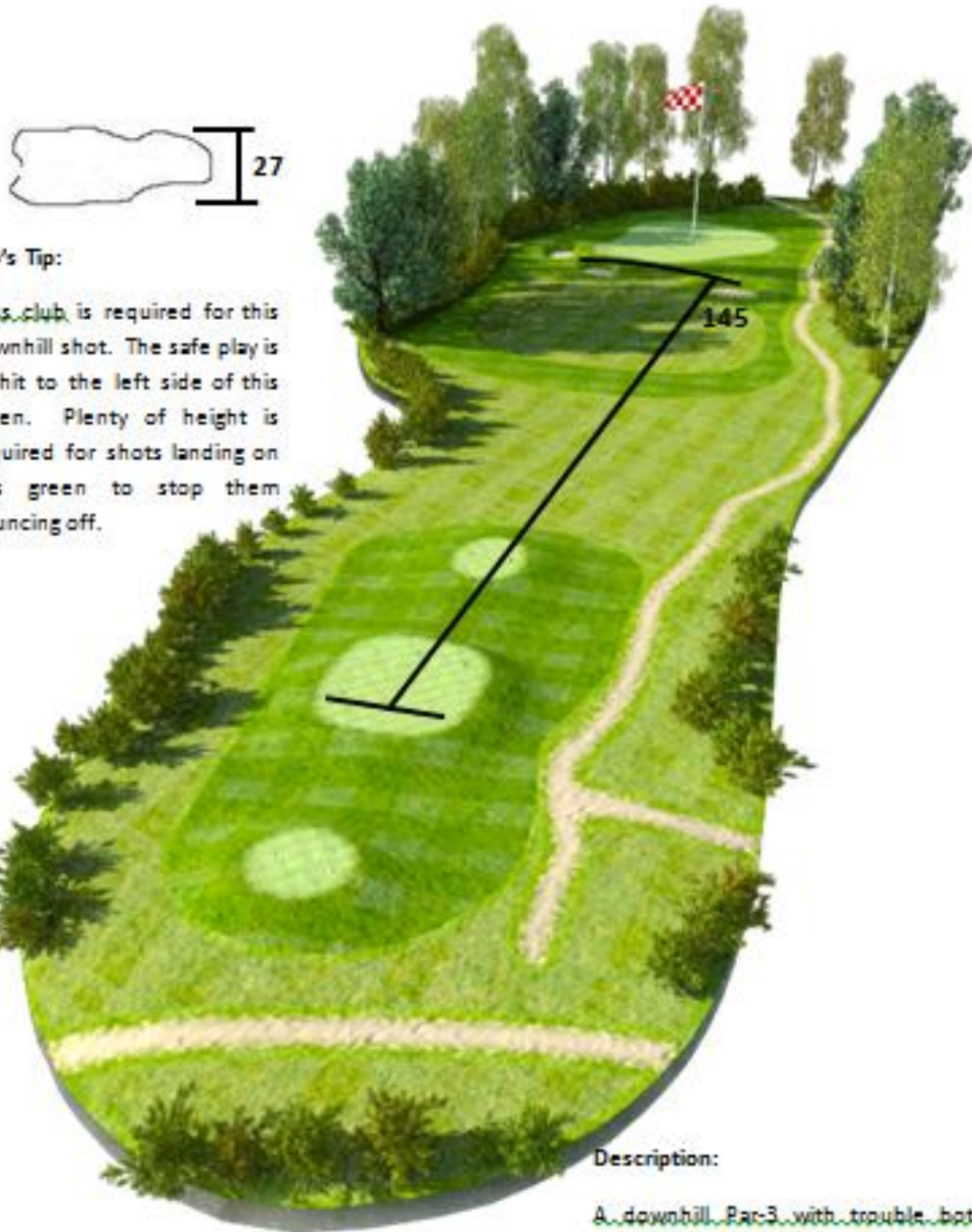
A tee shot to the right half of the fairway before the second ditch will open up a shot to the green. Anyone attempting to carry the ditch will be rewarded with an easier approach but will have to negotiate more hazards. Remember to take into account the uphill slope into this green as this will need an extra club.



Description:

A 90° dogleg with a ditch coming into play on the tee shot. The second shot will need to be hit over the trees if you do not risk the tee shot onto the second part of the fairway. Hitting into an uphill green, this will be one of the best chances to land the ball close to the hole.

HOLE 5 – 160m



Pro's Tip:

Less club is required for this downhill shot. The safe play is to hit to the left side of this green. Plenty of height is required for shots landing on this green to stop them bouncing off.

Description:

A downhill Par 3 with trouble both long and right. The bunker short of the green is still 20m from the green. Shots landed short will often bounce up to the middle of the green.

HOLE 6 – 530m



Description:

A very long Par 5. The tee shot must be hit between the bunker on the left and the rough mound on the right, longer tee shots will give an easier shot over the first of the two ditches. With a big green at the top of a hill, an extra club will be needed to reach the centre of it.

Pro's Tip:

Distance is everything on this hole. Tee shots over the top of the hill will present an easier chance to hit over the ditch. Approach shots to this green will need an extra two clubs for back pin positions.

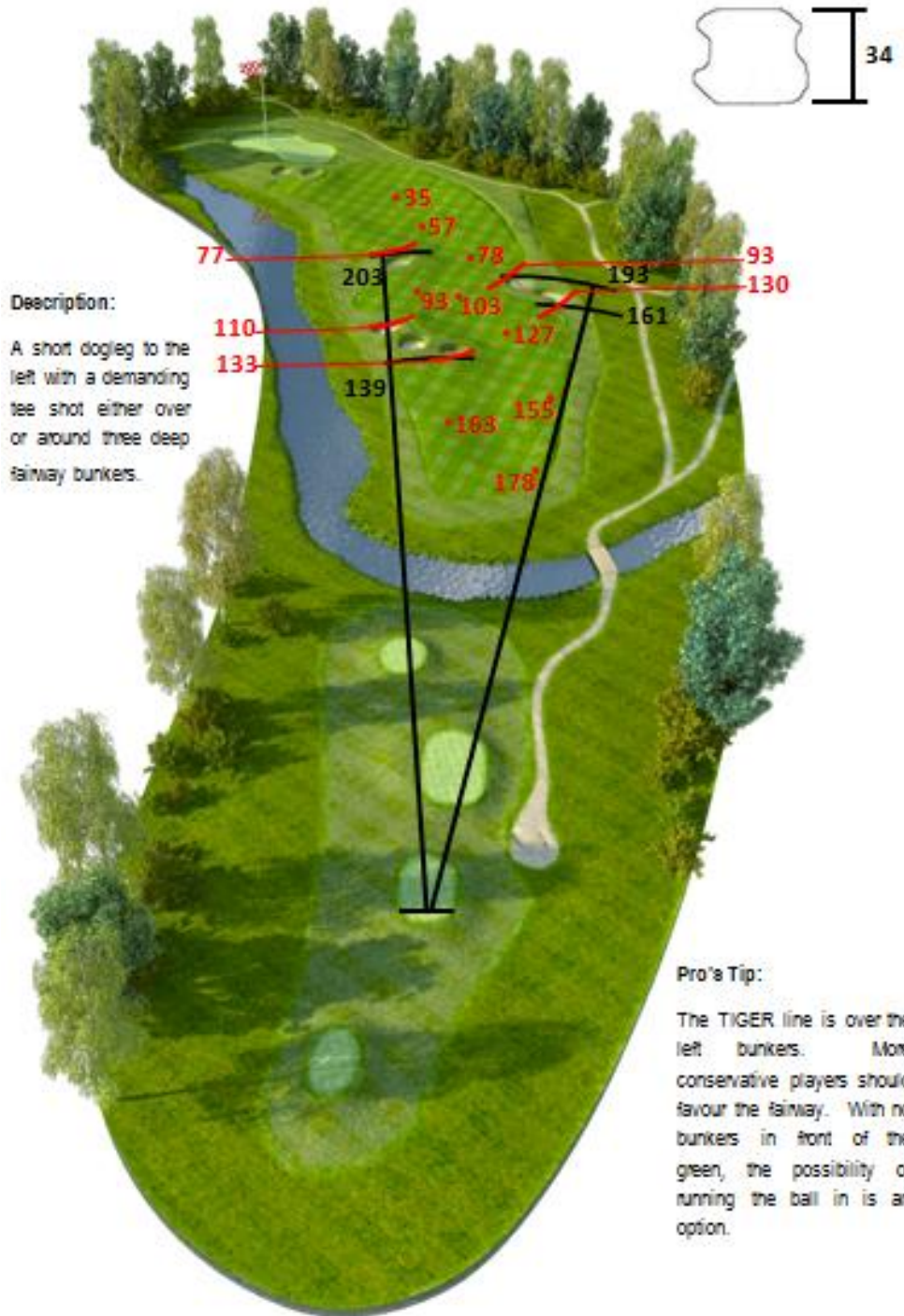

Description:

A narrow landing area with water hazards left and right; a straight shot up the left side will leave an iron shot up the hill to the green guarded by a deep bunker.

Pro's Tip:

Longer tee shots will take the water hazards out of play. Caution must be taken to avoid the strategically placed fairway bunkers on the right. An extra club will be required up the hill onto a very wide but not so long green.

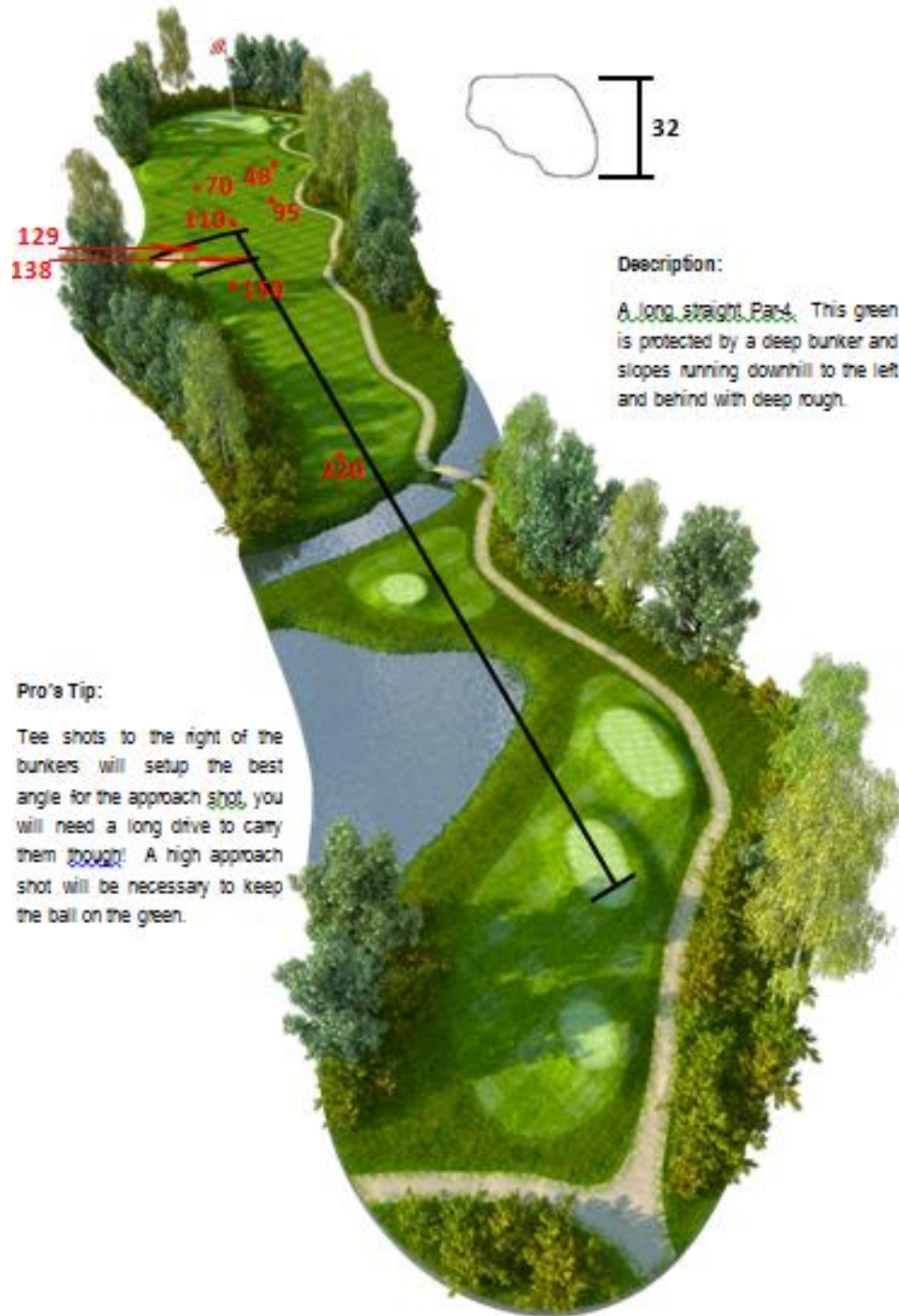
Description:

A short dogleg to the left with a demanding tee shot either over or around three deep fairway bunkers.

Pro's Tip:

The TIGER line is over the left bunkers. More conservative players should favour the fairway. With no bunkers in front of the green, the possibility of running the ball in is an option.

HOLE 9 – 346m



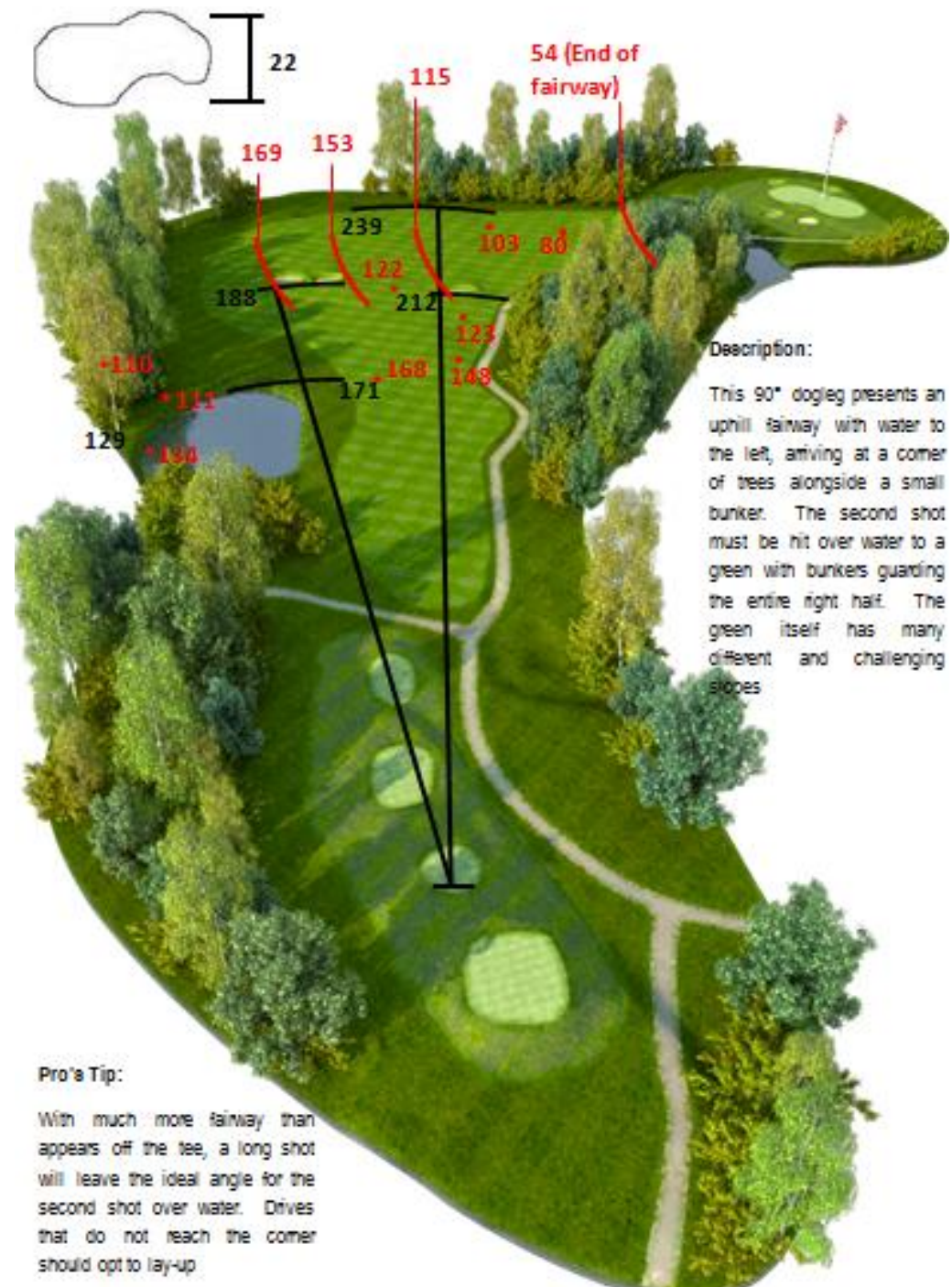
Description:

A long straight Par-4. This green is protected by a deep bunker and slopes running downhill to the left and behind with deep rough.

Pro's Tip:

Tee shots to the right of the bunkers will setup the best angle for the approach shot, you will need a long drive to carry them though! A high approach shot will be necessary to keep the ball on the green.

HOLE 10 – 355m



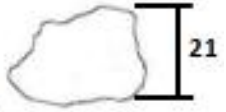
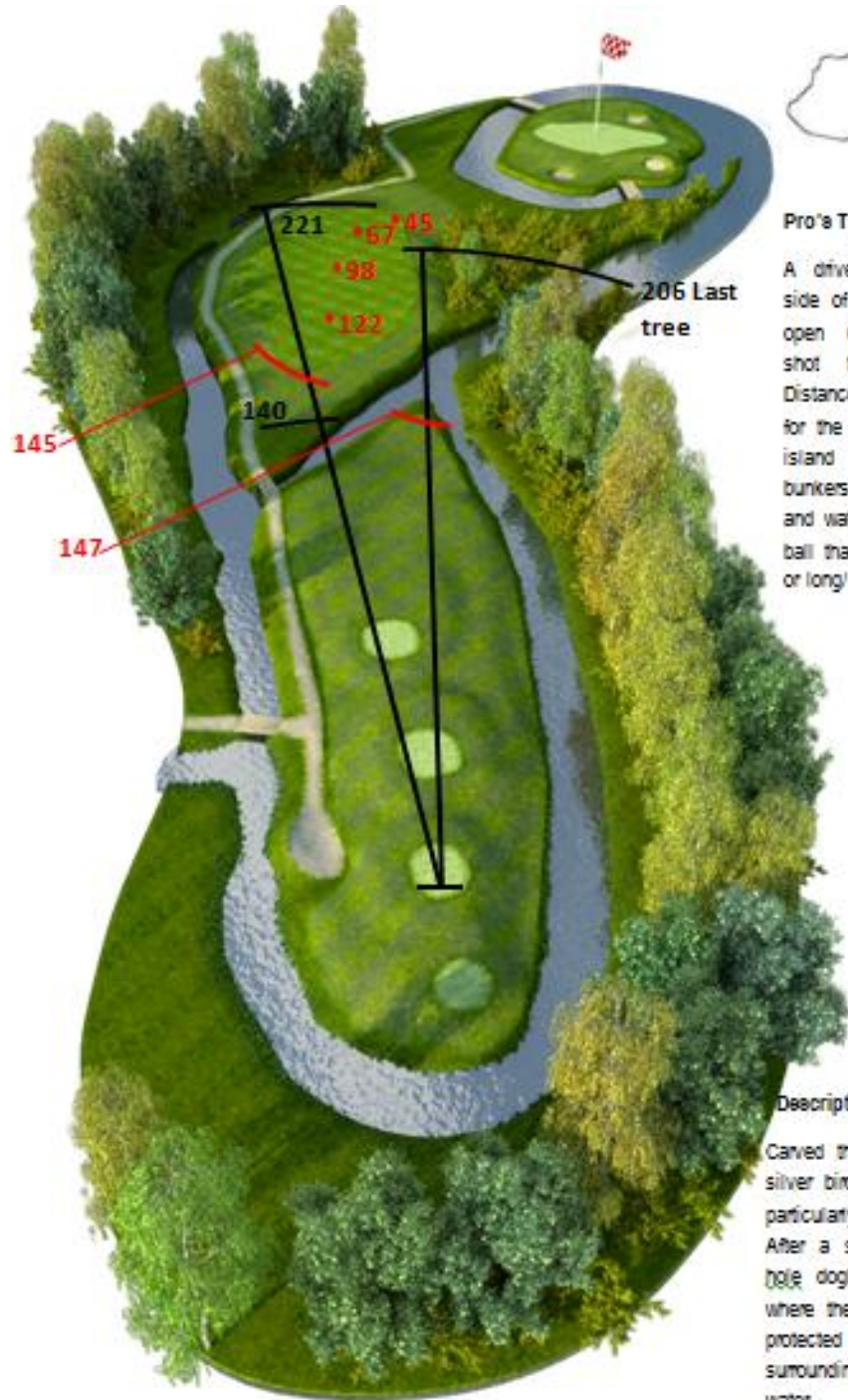
Description:

This 90° dogleg presents an uphill fairway with water to the left, arriving at a corner of trees alongside a small bunker. The second shot must be hit over water to a green with bunkers guarding the entire right half. The green itself has many different and challenging slopes.

Pro's Tip:

With much more fairway than appears off the tee, a long shot will leave the ideal angle for the second shot over water. Drives that do not reach the corner should opt to lay-up.

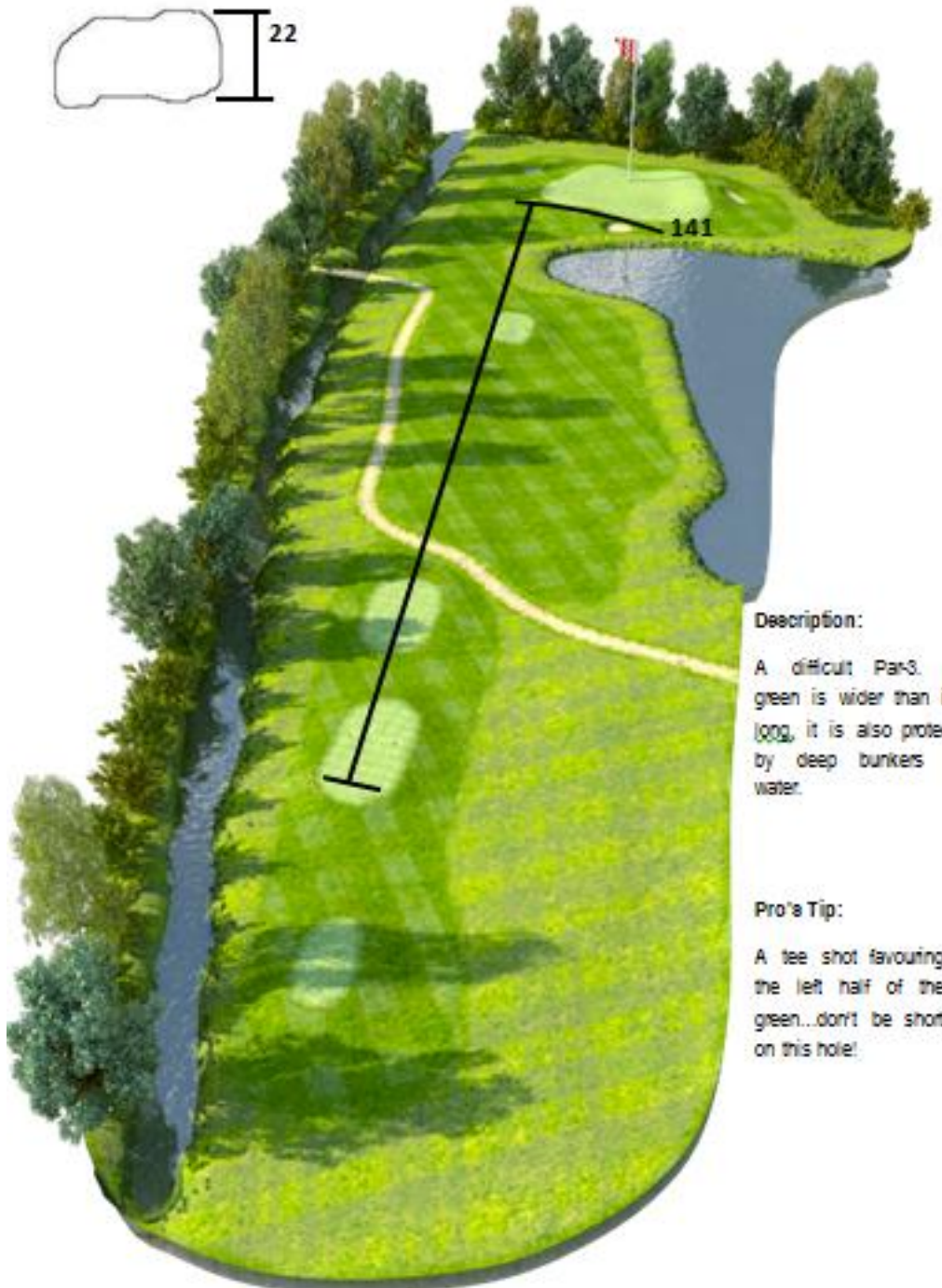
HOLE 11 – 305m



Pro's Tip:
A drive down the left side of the fairway will open up the second shot to this green. Distance control is vital for the approach to this island green as bunkers, deep rough and water will catch any ball that is offline, short or long!

Description:
Carved through a forest of silver birches, this hole is particularly picturesque. After a straight drive, the hole doglegs to the right where the island green is protected by both surrounding bunkers and water.

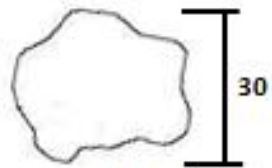
HOLE 12 – 152m



Description:
A difficult Par-3. The green is wider than it is long, it is also protected by deep bunkers and water.

Pro's Tip:
A tee shot favouring the left half of the green...don't be short on this hole!

HOLE 13 – 315m

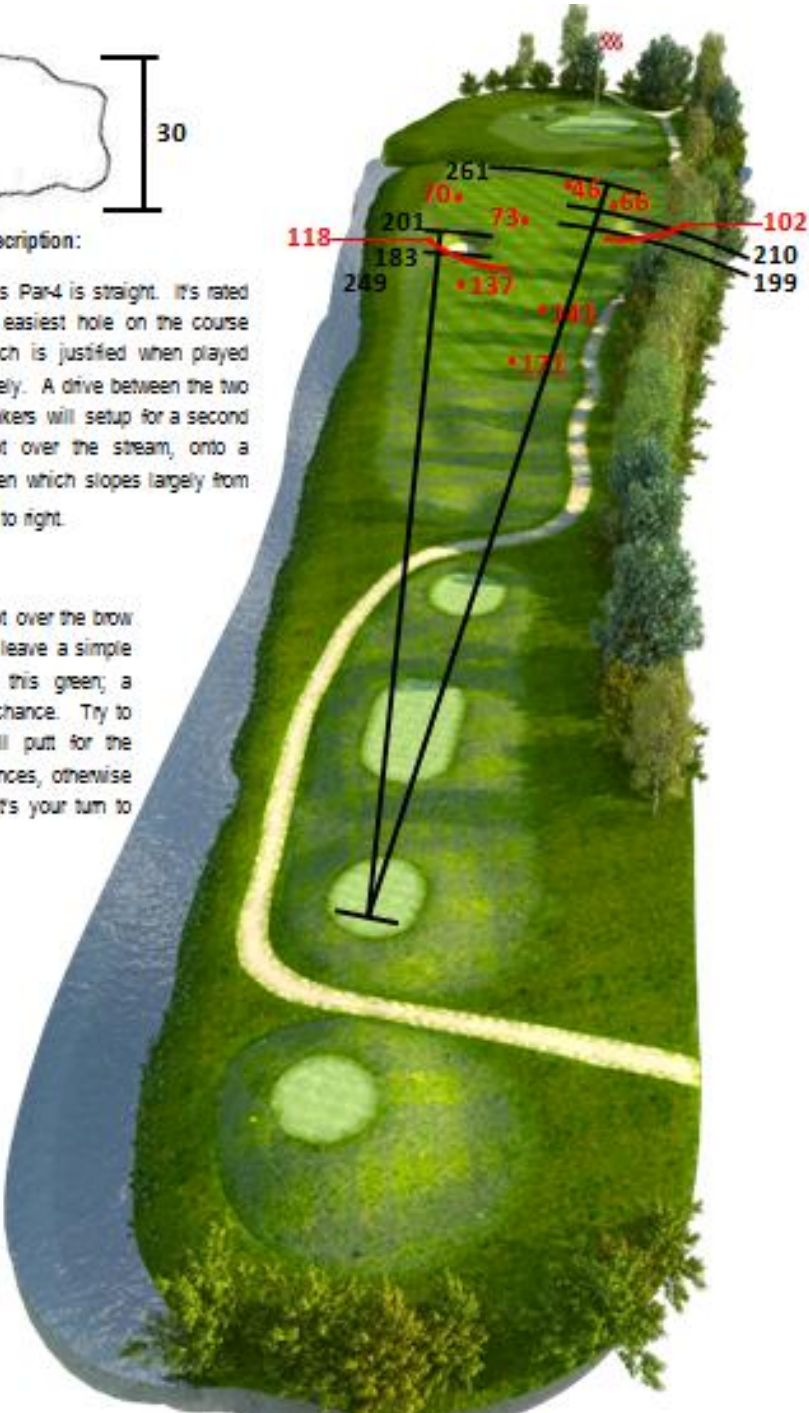


Description:

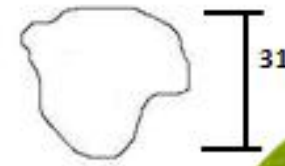
This Par-4 is straight. It's rated as easiest hole on the course which is justified when played safely. A drive between the two bunkers will setup for a second shot over the stream, onto a green which slopes largely from left to right.

Pro's Tip:

A long tee shot over the brow of the hill will leave a simple pitch shot to this green; a definite birdie chance. Try to leave an uphill putt for the easiest of chances, otherwise you may find it's your turn to putt again.



HOLE 14 – 161m



Description:

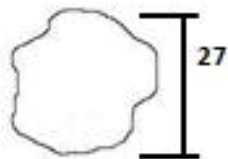
Modelled on a Scottish links design, this Par-3 is surrounded by many deep and difficult bunkers.

Pro's Tip:

Clubbing is vital on this shot especially when the wind is blowing. However, a narrow entrance to this green on the left offers an alternative route than carrying it all the way. The green is less undulating than others and so offers a good opportunity for birdies.



HOLE 15 – 359m



Description:

A straight hole with water to carry on the tee shot. Three fairway bunkers cover the right side of the fairway and water over the green will catch any too long shots.

Pro's Tip:

Play to the left of or over the 1st fairway bunker, any tee shots up the left half of the fairway will roll down to the middle. Do not be long with the second shot as rough and water await behind this green.

HOLE 16 – 557m



Pro's Tip:

The drive needs to be hit towards the evergreen tree at the end of the fairway. A second shot hit around the corner to the left side of the fairway will open up the next shot to this green. Take into account the downhill when approaching this green as the distance is shorter than it looks.



Description:

A double dogleg Par5 with a large green.

HOLE 17 – 342m

HOLE 18 – 465m

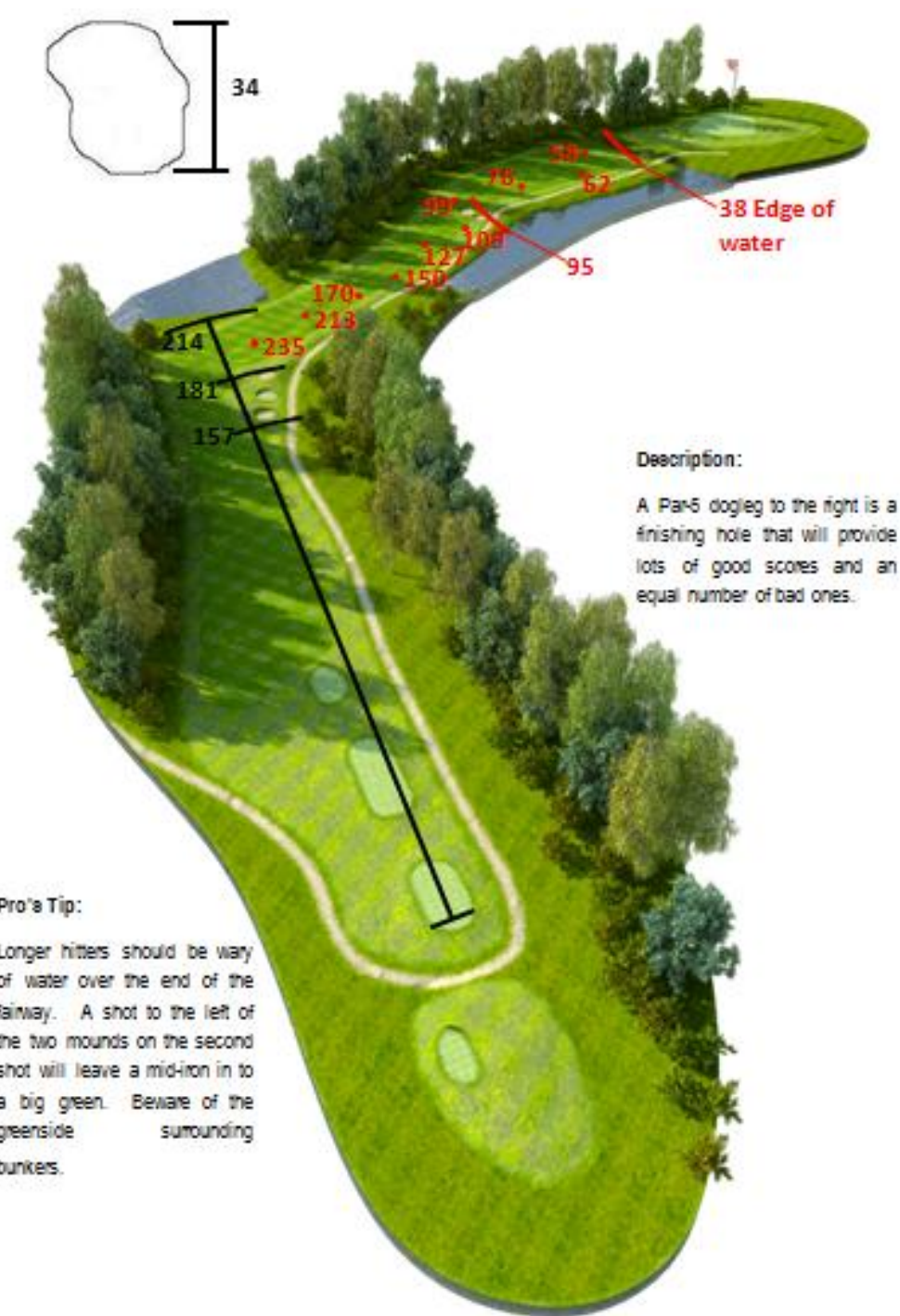


Pro's Tip:

For a more aggressive line from the tee, hit over the left side of the water. The safe strategy is to drive towards the bunkers. An approach shot to this elevated green needs to be well judged for distance because this green is very long and the flag could be at the back.

Description:

A dogleg Par-4 over water, hit to an elevated green.



Description:

A Par-5 dogleg to the right is a finishing hole that will provide lots of good scores and an equal number of bad ones.

Pro's Tip:

Longer hitters should be wary of water over the end of the fairway. A shot to the left of the two mounds on the second shot will leave a mid-iron in to a big green. Beware of the greenside surrounding bunkers.
